



## **Lewisville Lake Toll Bridge Now Open**

**Plano, TX** – Motorists now have the option to shorten their daily commute between Denton and Dallas as the North Texas Tollway Authority’s (NTTA) Lewisville Lake Toll Bridge (LLTB) was opened to traffic Saturday, Aug. 1, creating an east west connection between the Dallas North Tollway and Interstate Highway 35E.

“The LLTB is destined to become a Denton County landmark signifying improved mobility in the region,” said NTTA Chairman Paul N. Wageman. “The bridge will reconnect the Lake Dallas community to the rest of Denton County and by so doing provide its citizens with a significantly faster commute to points throughout the region.”

The toll rate for two axle vehicles will be \$1 for TollTag customers and the higher cash rate of \$1.50 for ZipCash drivers.

Construction on the much-anticipated LLTB began in late 2006. It features two lanes in each direction and an all-electronic toll collection (all-ETC) system on the project’s western approach. With all-ETC, drivers will not have to stop or look for change to pay the toll needed to drive over the bridge.

The LLTB design boasts a lighted, 360-foot-arch near the center of the bridge that is tied together 58 feet above the top of the bridge deck. Also at its center, the 8-foot-thick bridge deck structure sits 52 feet above the Lewisville Lake spillway elevation, meaning that the top of the arch soars 118 feet above the lake surface.

“This visually stunning project is part of a regional effort between the NTTA, Denton County, TxDOT, and the cities of Frisco, Little Elm and Lake Dallas,” said NTTA Denton County Board Director Dave Denison. “Even after the toll bridge opens, these partnerships will continue to work together to build the 13.8-mile Lewisville Lake corridor project, which includes the LLTB.”

In April, the NTTA Board of Directors approved interlocal agreements with Denton County and the Town of Little Elm to make improvements to roadways approaching the toll bridge.

“When the entire LLTB corridor is complete in the summer of 2013, the project will help create a significant impact on local and regional development, enhancing not only the growth of the area, but also its economic viability,” said NTTA Denton County Board Director Michael Nowels.

By the numbers:

LLTB length: Approximately 1.7 miles (Total corridor length: approx. 13.8 miles)
