AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES CONCERNING ENDANGERED SPECIES, INTERIOR LEAST TERN, Sterna antillarum

FOR THE PRESIDENT GEORGE BUSH TURNPIKE, SEGMENT IV (DNT 456)

THE STATE OF TEXAS

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COUNTY OF DALLAS

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THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), by and between the NORTH TEXAS

TOLLWAY AUTHORITY, a regional tollway authority and a political subdivision of the State of

Texas, hereinafter identified as the "Authority," and the CITY OF DALLAS, a Texas municipal

corporation, hereinafter identified as the "City," is to be effective as of the 9th day of April, 2003.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Authority constructs, operates, maintains, and periodically improves and modifies toll tumpike projects in certain counties in North-Central Texas, all in conformance with the provisions of Chapter 366, Texas Transportation Code, as amended (the "Regional Tollway Authority Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority proposes to design, construct, and operate Segment IV of the President George Bush Tumpike, hereinafter referred to as the "Project," along a route beginning at its northern terminus at I-35E to its southern terminus at I-635 in Dallas County, with a portion of the Project being situated within the municipal limits of the City, said Project being designed, constructed and operated as an extension and enlargement of the "Dallas North Tollway System"; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has retained HNTB Corporation to serve as general consulting engineer for the Project, said HNTB Corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Consulting Engineer") to represent and assist the Authority in the planning, design, review and coordination of the design and construction phases of the Project, including the work of the engineering firm(s)

responsible for designing any specific section of the Project (hereinafter referred to as the "Section Engineers"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority has retained the engineering firms listed in Exhibit A (said firms and/or their successors being hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Environmental Excellence Team") to monitor and ensure environmental compliance during the construction of the Project, including the construction of toll lanes, approaches, interchanges, ramps, toll facilities, bridges, buildings and the modification of existing pavement and structures, all to be operated and maintained by the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has retained the firm of Carter & Burgess, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the "Environmental Compliance Team Manager") to lead the Environmental Excellence Team set out on Exhibit A and monitor and ensure environmental compliance during construction of the Project.

WHEREAS, the Authority has retained Brown and Root, Inc. (hereinafter called the "Construction Manager") to provide the Authority with construction management engineering services for the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Authority, in consultation with the United States Department of the Interior, United States Fish & Wildlife Service (hereinafter "USF&W"), has determined that the endangered species known as the Interior Least Tern, *Sterna antillarum*, may nest or otherwise be present at or near the planned route of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Authority, in consultation with USF&W, has requested the City through the City of Dallas Zoo to provide, if necessary, certain services for performing surveys and monitoring the presence, if any, of the Interior Least Tern at the Project beginning in May, 2003, and continuing through the end of September of 2006; and

WHEREAS, the City shall perform such monitoring and surveying by using personnel

employed or trained at the City of Dallas Zoo (the "City/Zoo") (the Zoo being operated and managed by the City's Park and Recreation Department); and

WHEREAS, such City/Zoo personnel have particular expertise in the skills required to survey and monitor the presence of the Interior Least Term (such personnel being those persons employed or trained at the City/Zoo and referred to as "Qualified Personnel"); and

WHEREAS, the City is a Texas home rule municipal corporation with all of the authority and powers related thereto as prescribed by the laws of the States of Texas; and

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, as hereinafter set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Authority and the City agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. MONITORING, SURVEYING AND OTHER WORK TO BE PERFORMED BY THE CITY

A. The Monitoring and Surveying Work

During time periods set forth below, but in no event during time periods outside of May 1st – September 30th during the Term of this Agreement, Qualified Personnel shall perform the Monitoring and Surveying mandated as a result of the consultation between USF&W and the Authority. The term "Monitoring and Surveying," as used herein, means one-half hour to one-hour visual observations of the appropriate geographic areas identified below (collectively, "M&S Areas"; individually, an "M&S Area") during the periods of time set forth below, in order to monitor and survey the presence, if any, of Interior Least Terms at the Project. Surveys shall be conducted during the Interior Least Term's peak activity period (approximately 8:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.). In the event the City/Zoo believes Monitoring and Surveying in addition to that described

herein is needed, the City/Zoo shall notify the Environmental Compliance Team Manager of the location and expected duration of such additional Monitoring and Surveying. The Environmental Compliance Team Manager shall promptly reply to the City/Zoo concerning the City/Zoo's request for additional Monitoring and Surveying. Monitoring and Surveying requirements are more specifically described below:

- Personnel shall perform Monitoring and Surveying of Dallas Water Utilities

 Sedimentation Ponds Numbers 1, 2 and 3 and surrounding 300 foot buffer zone
 no less than three (3) times. The M&S Areas pertaining to Dallas Water Utilities

 Sedimentation Ponds Numbers 1, 2 and 3 are set forth on the attached Exhibit B.

 At least one (1) Monitoring and Surveying of the Dallas Water Utilities

 Sedimentation Ponds Numbers 1, 2 and 3 shall take place during each of the
 following time periods during the Term of this Agreement:
 - (a) Last week of May;
 - (b) June I to June 30;
 - (c) First week in July.
- Monitoring and Surveying of Pond Number 5 and its 300 foot buffer zone no less than three (3) times. The M&S Area pertaining to Pond Number 5 is set forth on the attached Exhibit C. At least one Monitoring and Surveying of Pond Number 5 shall take place during each of the following time periods during the Term of this Agreement:
 - (a) Last week of May;
 - (b) June 1 to June 30;

- (c) First week in July.
- Shall perform Monitoring and Surveying of VIA Cell Pond B and its 300 foot buffer zone as described below. The M&S Area pertaining to VIA Cell Pond B is set forth on the attached Exhibit D. At least one Monitoring and Surveying of VIA Cell Pond B shall take place during each of the following time periods during the Term of this Agreement:
 - (a) Last week of June;
 - (b) First week in July;
 - (c) Second week in July.

Qualified Personnel shall perform at least one additional Monitoring and Surveying of VIA Cell Pond B within one week prior to the start of construction activities in the M&S Area of VIA Cell Pond B, as specified in a notice from the Authority to the City/Zoo. If work lapses in the M&S Area of VIA Cell Pond B, but will recommence at a date specified by the Authority in a notice to the City/Zoo, Qualified Personnel shall perform at least one additional Monitoring and Surveying of VIA Cell Pond B within one week before the recommencement of such construction activities.

Hydraulic Mitigation Areas – The Authority's Clean Water Act Section 404

Permit (the "Permit") and the Authority's Environmental Impact Statement

Segment IV Corridor, I-35E to I-635 (the "EIS") describe locations along the

Project known as Hydraulic Mitigation Areas ("HMA"). Various excavation,

construction, and other earth-disturbing activities will take place within the

HMAs. If the Authority notifies the City/Zoo that work has lapsed for at least

seven days in an area of an HMA that contains more than one acre of disturbed earth, Qualified Personnel shall perform one additional Monitoring and Surveying of the disturbed earth area in the before the Authority recommences construction activities in such HMA. The locations of the HMAs are set forth on the attached Exhibit E.

B. Other Work

In addition to the Monitoring and Surveying services set forth in Article I.A, the City/Zoo shall perform the additional work and provide the other services set forth below:

- (1) Representatives of the City/Zoo will communicate with and meet with environmental groups or representatives of environmental groups to discuss the impact of the construction on the Interior Least Tern(s), the City/Zoo's and the Authority's plan for Monitoring and Surveying of the Interior Least Tern(s), the City/Zoo's role in the consultation between the Authority and USF&W, as well as such other related topics as may be necessary or desirable. At a minimum, the City/Zoo shall meet on an annual basis with the Authority, the Authority's counsel and the Environmental Compliance Team Manager, as well as others, if desirable, to assess the Monitoring and Surveying, its effectiveness, and improvements that could be made to assure continued environmental compliance. The Authority, when necessary or desirable, may call additional meetings to be attended by the City/Zoo, and any other parties whose attendance is helpful, in analyzing the issues then being addressed.
- (2) The City/Zoo shall train and coordinate a team of volunteers ("the Volunteers") who shall, as a consequence of their training and oversight by Qualified Personnel, have the expertise to serve as Qualified Personnel; Volunteers may

monitor and survey those areas set forth in Article I.A on a bi-weekly basis. In general, Volunteers shall Monitor and Survey the M&S Areas from off-site by visual means (e.g. binoculars). Volunteers are provided by the Dallas Zoological Society for the City/Zoo. The Volunteers are insured under the Dallas Zoological Society Liability Insurance Policy.

- (3) The Volunteers shall be trained by the City/Zoo or the Authority to understand, follow, and they shall follow, all safety rules and safety construction practices used and implemented by Authority, the Environmental Compliance Team, the Consulting Engineer, the Section Engineers, and the Construction Manager in connection with the Project. Additionally, each Qualified Personnel and Volunteer must execute an Acknowledgment of Training in the form attached hereto as Exhibit F as a condition to performing any Monitoring or Surveying or any other activity in the Project area. The City/Zoo shall submit such written evidence and Acknowledgment of Training timely. The Authority shall respond in a timely manner. The Authority retains the right, in its sole discretion, to refuse entry of any person to, or to remove any previously admitted person from, the construction area of the Project. Any Volunteer admitted to the construction area of the Project shall wear proper safety equipment, display proper identification at all times, and promptly comply with all instructions provided by the Authority's contractors and consultants.
- (4) The City/Zoo shall develop a bilingual (English / Spanish) written, VHS and/or computer-assisted presentation to assist the Authority, the Environmental Excellence Team, the Consulting Engineer, the Section Engineers, the Construction Manager, their subcontractors and representatives in identifying

Interior Least Terns, as well as other birds likely to be encountered during construction of the Project. The presentation shall also include information on the Interior Least Tern's habits, manner, nesting and breeding activities, as well as effective practices for avoiding the Interior Least Tern(s) and its habitat. The Authority shall document attendance.

Qualified Personnel and Volunteers shall monitor, survey, and document the (5) reproductive success, if any, of the Interior Least Tern should it nest and/or breed in an M&S Area. Monitoring for reproductive success of an Interior Least Tern colony will require an on-the-ground walk-through of the M&S Areas set forth in Article I.A. Should Interior Least Terns be observed in an M&S Area, an on-theground walk-through of that area shall be performed by the Qualified Personnel (but not Volunteers) on an as-needed basis, but in any event, no less frequently than weekly during active nesting periods to be determined by USF&W. The City/Zoo shall arrange for access for such Qualified Personnel by contacting the Environmental Compliance Team Manager. During the walk-through(s) Qualified Personnel (but not Volunteers) shall be accompanied by the Environmental Compliance Team Manager. No less than 24-hours prior to the on-the-ground walk-through, but as soon as practicable, the City/Zoo shall notify the Authority of the planned on-the-ground walk-through. The City/Zoo shall coordinate with the Authority, and if deemed desirable by the Authority, the Consulting Engineer, the Section Engineers, and Construction Manager, to determine the appropriate day, time and place for any such on-the-ground walkthrough.

- (6) In addition to any other notices required by this Agreement, the City/Zoo shall promptly notify the Authority, the Consulting Engineer, the Section Engineers, and the Construction Manager by e-mail of the results of any Monitoring and Surveying.
- Agreement, which shall include, *inter alia*, information on the number of adults, nests, and offspring of Interior Least Terns observed by the City in the M&S Areas, as well as the documentation of all Monitoring and Surveying results. Any and all such documentation, including any reports, shall be and are the property of the Authority, although the City/Zoo may use such reports and documentation in connection with its scientific, biological, conservation, or zoological activities. The City/Zoo shall provide a preliminary report on any improvements needed or deficiencies noted by September 30 during the Term of this Agreement.

ARTICLE II. QUALIFIED PERSONNEL

All work to be performed by the City/Zoo under this Agreement shall be performed by Qualified Personnel. Notwithstanding anything else herein to the contrary, the work set forth in Article I.A shall be performed by Jeanette T. Boylan, PhD, who is supervised by the Curator of Conservation Education and Science, or a comparably experienced and educated replacement acceptable to the Authority. The training and notification set forth in Article I.B, subsections (1), (2), (3), (5), and (7), shall be performed by Dr. Boylan or a comparably experienced and educated replacement. The other work to be performed under Article I.B shall be performed by persons trained by or under the control and supervision of Dr. Boylan or her designee. For purposes of this Agreement, the term Qualified Personnel shall include Dr. Boylan, and those trained by her who are under her supervision and control, including the Volunteers. Dr. Boylan shall provide the Authority Agreement for Services Concerning

with a list of suitable replacement candidates who could complete her term for the duration of construction should she be unwilling or unable to perform her responsibilities under this Agreement.

ARTICLE III. THE AUTHORITY'S OBLIGATIONS

A. <u>Compensation in Payment for Work to be Performed by the City and The Zoo</u> <u>Pursuant to This Agreement</u>

(1) Equipment and Supplies

As compensation for the work to be performed pursuant to this Agreement, the Authority, prior to May 15, 2003, shall make a one-time donation to the Dallas Zoological Society's Conservation Fund in the amount of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00). The Authority shall make a supplementary contribution of \$3,000.00 to the Dallas Zoological Society Conservation Fund for each year the City/Zoo renders Monitoring and Surveying Services as set forth in this Agreement. The Authority's supplemental contribution shall be made by May 15 of each year during the Term of this Agreement. Among other items, the Authority's \$4,500.00 contribution shall be used for equipment and supplies.

(2) Salary Reimbursement

As additional compensation for the work to be performed pursuant to this Agreement the Authority, on or before May 15 for each year during the Term of this Agreement, shall pay to the Dallas Zoo Education Trust Fund an annual payment of ten-thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) to reimburse the City/Zoo for time spent performing Monitoring and Surveying during that year. The City/Zoo acknowledges and agrees that such payments are of benefit to the City/Zoo and is good and adequate consideration for the services to be performed under this Agreement by Qualified Personnel and other City employees.

B. Other Materials and Instruction Provided by the Authority

In addition to the payments set forth in Article III. A., the Authority shall:

- (1) Provide aerial photos of the Project to the City/Zoo;
- (2) Subject to availability, provide space for the City/Zoo's use in the construction trailer for the Project;
- (3) Provide the City/Zoo with contact information for Environmental Excellence

 Team members, and appropriate NTTA staff;
- (4) Provide the City/Zoo access to GPS equipment to aid monitoring efforts when available;
- (5) Should any of the equipment or supplies used by Qualified Personnel be lost, stolen or destroyed, the Authority shall either replace such equipment or supplies or shall reimburse the City/Zoo so that replacement equipment or supplies can be purchased.

ARTICLE IV. COMMUNICATION PROTOCOLS

These protocols shall be followed by the City, the Zoo, all Qualified Personnel, and all Volunteers to ensure and maintain effective communication between the City and the Authority. These protocols may be amended at any time in the sole discretion of the Authority.

A. The Interior Least Tern or Its Habitat is Not in Danger of Harm

In circumstances where the Interior Least Tern or its habitat is not in danger of harm the following communication protocols shall be observed:

(1) Volunteers and other Qualified Personnel shall communicate any concerns, observations, or results of Monitoring and Surveying to Dr. Boylan or her designee;

(2) Dr. Boylan or her designee shall communicate any concerns or observations to the Environmental Compliance Team Manager;

(3) The Environmental Compliance Team Manager shall record communications from Dr. Boylan and, as appropriate, notify the Construction Manager.

B. The Interior Least Tern or Its Habitat Is in Danger of Harm

In circumstances where the Interior Least Tern or its habitat is in danger of harm the following communication protocols shall be observed:

- (1) Volunteers and other Qualified Personnel shall communicate any concerns, observations, or results of Monitoring and Surveying to Dr. Boylan or her designee and the Environmental Compliance Team Manager;
- (2) Dr. Boylan or her designee shall confirm any communication that the Interior Least Tern or its habitat is in danger of harm to the Environmental Compliance Team Manager. If Dr. Boylan confirms such condition, she shall notify the USF&WS. Immediately after notifying the USF&WS, Dr. Boylan shall notify the Construction Manager and the Environmental Compliance Team Manager so that construction activities may be suspended, and the Interior Least Tern or its habitat protected, in the area(s) of concern.
- (3) Dr. Boylan or her designee shall communicate with the Authority, the Environmental Compliance Team Manager, and others if necessary, to assess any dangers of harm or taking of the Interior Least Tern or its habitat, and to establish a protocol, for approval by USF&WS, to address then existing conditions.

ARTICLE V. LIABILITY GENERALLY

A. Liability

The City/Zoo and the Authority each agrees to be responsible for all damages, including, claims for personal injury or for damages to property, and all court costs, attorneys' fees, and all expenses arising out of each of its own negligent or otherwise tortious acts or omissions in the performance of the work and other obligations that are the subject of this Agreement.

B. <u>Limitations</u>

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to place any liability on either the Authority or the Consulting Engineer, Environmental Excellence Team, Environmental Compliance Team Manager, Construction Manager or Section Engineers for personal injury to persons or property damage arising out of the work to be performed under this Agreement by the City (whether the City acts through Zoo personnel or otherwise). Similarly, it is not the intent of this Agreement to impose upon the City or the Zoo any liability for injury to persons or property damage arising out of action or inaction of the Authority or its agents, directors, officers, employees, contractors, or consultants (other than the City), or any construction unrelated to the terms of this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver of any rights which may be asserted by either party hereto, including the defense of governmental immunity or other defenses available to the parties.

ARTICLE VI. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

A. Relationship of the Parties

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed by the parties, or by any third party, as creating the relationship of principal and agent, partnership, joint enterprise, or joint venture between the City and the Authority.

B. Notices

In each instance under this Agreement in which one party is required or permitted to give notice to the other, such notice shall be deemed given (i) when delivered in hand, (ii) one (1) business day after being deposited with a reputable overnight air courier service, or (iii) three (3) business days after being mailed by United States mail, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and, in all events, addressed as follows:

With copy to: Environmental Compliance Team Manager

Either party hereto may from time to time change its address for notification purposes by giving the other party prior written notice of the new address and the date upon which it will become effective.

C. Successors and Assigns

This Agreement shall bind, and shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of, the respective parties and their legal successors. Other than as provided in the preceding sentence, neither the City nor the Authority shall assign, sublet, or transfer their respective interests in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party to this Agreement.

D. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is rendered or declared illegal for any reason and shall be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the Agreement and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby, but shall be enforced to the greatest extent permitted by applicable law.

E. Written Amendments

Any change in the agreement, terms and/or responsibilities of the parties hereto must be enacted through a written amendment. No amendment to this Agreement shall be of any effect unless in writing and executed by the City and the Authority.

F. <u>Limitations</u>

All covenants and obligations of the City and the Authority under this Agreement shall be deemed to be valid covenants and obligations of said entities, and no officer, director, or employee of the City or the Authority shall have any personal obligations or liability hereunder.

G. Sole Benefit

This Agreement is entered into for the sole benefit of the City and the Authority and their respective successors and permitted assigns. Nothing in this Agreement or in any approval

subsequently provided by either party hereto shall be construed as giving any benefits, rights, remedies, or claims to any other person, firm, corporation or other entity, including, without limitation, the public in general.

H. <u>Authorization</u>

This Agreement is entered into subject to the provisions of the City's charter and the ordinances of the City and all applicable state and federal laws and the applicable regulations of administrative agencies with jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Agreement. Each party to this Agreement represents to the other that it is fully authorized to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligations hereunder, and that no waiver, consent, approval, or authorization from any third party is required to be obtained or made in connection with the execution, delivery, or performance of this Agreement. Each signatory on behalf of the City and the Authority, as applicable, is fully authorized to bind that entity to the terms of this Agreement.

I. Venue

The provisions of this Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws and court decisions of the State of Texas, and exclusive venue for any legal actions arising hereunder shall be in Dallas County, Texas.

J. Interpretation

No provision of this Agreement shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of any party by any court, other governmental or judicial authority, or arbitrator by reason of such party having or being deemed to have drafted, prepared, structured, or dictated such provision.

K. Waiver

No delay or omission by either party hereto to exercise any right or power hereunder shall impair such right or power or be construed as a waiver thereof. A waiver by either of the parties hereto of any of the covenants, conditions, or agreements to be performed by the other or any breach

thereof shall not be construed to be a waiver of any succeeding breach thereof or of any other covenant, condition, or agreement herein contained.

L. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. There are no representations, understanding, or agreements relative hereto which are not fully expressed in this Agreement.

M. Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all such counterparts shall constitute one single agreement between the parties.

N. <u>Term of Agreement</u>

The term of this agreement is for periodic services to be performed between May 1 and September 30 for the years 2003 through 2006.

O. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated by either party one-hundred eighty (180) days after delivering to the other party notice, in writing, of its intention to terminate.

P. <u>Effective Date</u>

The effective date of this Agreement shall be the date on which it is approved by the City Council of the City of Dallas.

Q. Captions

The captions used in this Agreement are for informational purposes only and shall not alter the substance of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

This Agreement is executed this 9th day of April 2003, as authorized by City Council Resolution No. 03-1209, approved by the City Council of the City of Dallas, Texas on April 9, 2003.

M&S AREA FOR DALLAS WATER UTILITIES SEDIMENTATION PONDS NUMBERS 1, 2 AND 3




Figure 3-8. Location of Jurisdictional Waters of the U.S., including Wetlands, in Surveyed Areas of the Project Corridor, from IH-35E to South of Belt Line Road




Figure 3-8. Location of Jurisdictional Waters of the U.S., including Wetlands, in Surveyed Areas of the Project Corridor, from IH-35E to South of Belt Line Road




Figure 3-9. Location of Jurisdictional Waters of the U.S., including Wetlands, in Surveyed Areas of the Project Corridor, from South of Belt Line Road to IH-635

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SITE SPECIFIC HAZARD TRAINING

	I,, hereby acknowledge that prior to my entering the construction
area	a for the President George Bush Turnpike Segment IV (the "Site") I have received construction
and	safety training in the following areas:

- 1. Moving Equipment: Seatbelts must be worn while operating a vehicle on the Site.

 Persons on the Site must be alert and remain clear of moving equipment. Persons on the Site must make sure that the operator of moving equipment knows other people are nearby. Persons on the Site must be aware of specific traffic or driving hazards associated with the Site or any portion of it. Vehicles and people are not to be placed in front of or behind mobile equipment.
- 2. <u>Traffic Pattern</u>: Traffic pattern at the Site is right hand unless posted otherwise.
- 3. Right-of-Way: All heavy equipment always has the right-of-way.
- 4. Moving Machinery: Persons on the Site must be alert and remain clear of moving machinery. Persons on the Site shall not work on or around machinery that is moving, or has not been properly stopped, blocked or secured to make it safe from movement.
- 5. <u>Personal Protective Equipment</u>: Appropriate personal protective equipment shall be worn while on the Site. This includes a hard hat, safety or steel toed shoes or boots, and safety glasses at all time. Hearing protection, life jackets, and respiratory equipment may be required in certain areas.
- 6. <u>Fire Hazards</u>: All no smoking signs in areas where flammables are stored or present must be obeyed. Persons on the Site shall avoid areas where welding or other fire hazards exist. Persons on the Site shall be aware of the locations of fire

extinguishers and other fire fighting equipment in each work area.

- 7. Weather: All necessary precautions will be taken during extreme weather conditions including, extreme heat, storms, and high winds.
- 8. Other Potential Hazards: The Site includes wetlands, swamps, and water bodies which may have shifting sands, quick sands, or other unstable footing. Persons on the Site shall be aware of the terrain in which they are working.

I have read this acknowledgment and understand it. I understand that I am responsible for my own acts and conduct while on the Site. I understand that the Authority will be held harmless from any and all liability, loss or expense, associated with any negligent or intentionally wrongful conduct by me while I am on the Site.

WHEREAS, the City Charter provides for the Park and Recreation Board to grant contracts and agreements within park facilities with such terms and conditions as it shall deem proper; and

WHEREAS, the City Charter requires that the City Council shall approve any contract which exceeds one year in duration; and

WHEREAS, the City of Dallas is the owner of a public facility committed to the conservation of wildlife for future generations known as the Dallas Zoo; and

WHEREAS, Dallas Zoo personnel have particular expertise in the skills required to survey and monitor the presence of the Endangered Species, Interior Least Tern, Stema Antillarum; and

WHEREAS, the North Texas Tollway Authority ("NTTA"), in consultation with the United States Department of the Interior, United States Fish and Wildlife Service, has determined that this endangered bird species may nest or otherwise be present at or near the planned route of the NTTA's President George Bush Turnpike, Segment IV, Turnpike Project; and

WHEREAS, the NTTA has requested the Dallas Zoo to provide certain services for performing and monitoring for the presence of the endangered Interior Least Tern at their Turnpike Project, beginning May 2003 and continuing through the species' 2003 breeding season, and resuming again for the species' 2004, 2005, and 2006 breeding seasons.

WHEREAS, the NTTA will provide a donation to the Dallas Zoological Society's Conservation Fund in the amount of \$4,500.00 in year 2003 and \$3,000 for years 2004 through 2006. This money will be utilized to purchase equipment and supplies for this project. Now Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PARK AND RECREATION BOARD AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

SECTION 1. That services by Dallas Zoo staff to perform surveys and monitoring will be provided to the NTTA beginning May 2003 and continue during the Terns' breeding season (ending no later than 30 September 2003) and continuing during the breeding seasons of 2004, 2005, and 2006.
