Red Thumb Program Urges Drivers not to Text Behind the Wheel

PLANO, Texas – May 10, 2018 – This is Red Thumb Day, when people across the world color some part of their thumbs red in an effort to end texting while driving. The North Texas Tollway Authority (NTTA) encourages drivers to keep their thumbs off their phones, hands on the wheel and eyes on the road whenever they drive.

"Driving while 'intexticated' is now illegal in Texas," said NTTA Director of System and Incident Management Eric Hemphill. "Since 2015, the Red Thumb program has promoted a simple idea: 'Stay Alive. Just Drive.'"

Thumb bands are available for free at any NTTA <u>Customer Service Center</u>. Drivers can also paint a thumb nail red or use their creativity to remind themselves to put their phones down while driving.

Data shows those who text while driving are 23 percent more likely to be involved in a crash.



With nearly 40 municipal and community partners throughout North Texas, more than 120,000 specially made NTTA "W8 2 TXT" (wait to text) thumb bands are on drivers' thumbs.
