Excellent Quality Demands Full-Time

**Maintenance:** In a 2022 customer survey, 93% of NTTA drivers rated the quality of our toll roads either excellent or good. Maintenance staff works 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, to both make repairs and proactively maintain our toll roads.



**Clean and Safe:** In that same survey, 92% rated the cleanliness of NTTA roads either excellent or good. Maintenance crew members routinely perform litter pickup and remove debris to keep all our roads clean and safe.



**Move Over Law Importance:** For your safety and ours, please remember to always follow the Move Over Law. It requires drivers to move over a lane or slow to 20 miles per hour below the posted speed limit when approaching an authorized emergency vehicle (including NTTA's Maintenance or Roadside Safety Services vehicles) using visual signals or flashing lights.
